



I think that something to the effect that dry dock work is a lot like having your car go in for major work - how long it actually take is only a guess at the start. A HUGE thing islanders could do to help with the 'confusion' factor would be to require all real estate salespeople and rental owners to disclose annual dry dock information (ie, no car ferry etc) to their customers. I personally a small 10 or so temporary car ferry (like the Trek) would NOT be useful - it could not substitute for the larger Chief and would just cause confusion and competition for the fewer spaces. This should not be considered unless we know the *full financial costs* and absolute willingness of ALL ferry users to pay for obtaining that information and then to pay the bill.
